**Public Authority's Mission:**

The purposes of the Livingston County Development Corporation are to relieve and reduce unemployment, to promote and provide for additional employment, to maintain job opportunities and to better said job opportunities, to instruct and train individuals to improve or to develop their capabilities for jobs, to carry on scientific research for the purpose of adding the county by attracting business and industry to the area, or by encouraging the development of, or retention of business in the area and to lessen the burden of government and to act in the public interest.

**2016 Performance Goals:**

Working with all economic development partners, the Livingston County Development Corporation will:

- Support entrepreneurship and small business development in all sectors of the economy.
- Provide training, technical assistance, incentives and other forms of direct support to entrepreneurs and new business start-ups.
- Assist businesses and municipalities with the planning, funding, development, redevelopment and enhancement of commercial buildings and districts.
- Undertake or cause to have undertaken marketing efforts both inside and outside Livingston County that target increased commerce, business investment, sales tax generation and the attraction of new companies, people, and investment to the County.
