County approves Brew in Livingston grant application

Livingston County's Board of Supervisors unanimously approved submission of a grant application Wednesday that would partially fund a brewery business plan competitor coordinated by Livingston County Development, the county's economic development

The competition, called Brew in Livingston, would give \$600,000 in grant funds, low interest loans and other incentives to four entrepreneurs looking to start or expand a brewery in Livingston County.

A public hearing was scheduled for the Board of Supervisors' regular meeting Wednesday at which county residents could comment on the proposed competition and the county's grant application.

No one spoke at the public hearing, however.

The approved application is seeking a \$184,000 Community Development Block Grant that would partially fund the awards for the Brew in Livingston competition.

Bill Bacon, director of Livingston County Development, said the application will be submitted to the state July 29 and that he expects to find out whether it was approved in November or December.
